FROM THE PASTOR’S PEN

PANDEMIC-ED

If you are playing Scrabble (or planning to), I should say right away that the verb in this title does not exist. :) However, as we are all painfully aware by now, the noun very much exists, and has become one of the most common words in our lexicon. As one of my favorite humor writers, Lewis Grizzard, was fond of saying: *“Who would have thunk it?”* (He was famous for his word play and imagery).

Well, at the start of this year, we would not have “thunk” it. The pandemic has certainly wrecked chaos and tragedy upon so much of the world. And yet, for over half the world’s population, the virus is not among their chief concerns. That does not diminish the enormity of the pain and suffering caused by the virus, but rather it points to the suffering and tragedy of various types that is experienced by so many people in so many countries.

Most people who are able to take the time to study in-depth some of the major problems that produce suffering, say that many of these problems are preventable. Not ALL of them are preventable! (a key take-home message from our July 5th worship), and, the key level of prevention varies from the individual to the global level - and everywhere in-between.

This blog is not to point out how terrible a shape the world is in, but how we, as God’s people, are Called and empowered to make a difference on some level to help our neighbor (Remember *Luke 10*, and the parable of the Good Samaritan!). An overall look at global suffering can overwhelm us; a peek at individual suffering can (if we let the Holy Spirit move us) stir us to action.


Do you know of someone who has lost their job during this pandemic? Share some food and drink with them; or, if you’re able, a job or project.

WHEN IS A LITTLE WATER LEAK NOT SO LITTLE? When a 50-year old water fountain in the gym springs a leak sometime after 6:00 PM on a Friday in June. Kristi got the call Saturday night at 8:00 PM from the fire alarm company about a fire in the building. Seems the water fountain had sprung a leak and the water made a path to the MLFLC Director's office. The inch of water caused the fire to start at the power strip under the desk. Our quick-thinking volunteers went to work. They shut off the power to the office, shut off the water to the fountain, and moved furniture away from the standing water. The JWPC crew then called ServPro. They came within 30 minutes to pull up nearly 100 gallons of water. Fans were brought in to dry the flooring and kept running until Monday morning. Monday morning brought an electrician to repair the damaged outlet, a plumber to remove the bad fountain, and the fire extinguisher company to recharge the extinguisher.
